## **Curriculum Implementation**

King David School has entered an exciting new chapter as part of the Unity School Partnership. This strategic collaboration has enabled the school to adopt the Unity School Partnership Curriculum (CUSP) across several key subjects, including Writing, Reading at Key Stage 2, Science, Geography, History, Art, Design Technology, and Music. This transition represents a significant and purposeful investment in the professional development of our staff, the enhancement of pedagogical resources, and the broader enrichment of our curriculum.

Implementation is focused on embedding the CUSP framework seamlessly into our existing practices, with a clear emphasis on maintaining and enhancing standards of teaching and learning. During this phase, staff are undertaking extensive training and refinement to ensure the curriculum aligns effectively with the specific needs and ethos of King David School.

Additionally, the school uses White Rose to structure its teaching of mathematics, with the emphasis on teachers adapting planning to suit the specific needs of pupils. At the heart of our Early Reading model is the teaching of Phonics through the accredited scheme Read, Write Inc. The on-going training of staff ensures the scheme is taught with fidelity.

## **Curriculum Impact**

The ultimate aim of the King David curriculum is to nurture well-rounded, confident, and capable pupils who possess a strong moral compass and are equipped with knowledge. King David pupils will know how to keep themselves safe, healthy whilst developing resilience necessary for success in their future education and beyond. We are driven to ensure all pupils reach the national standard or higher by the end of keystage 2. We have developed a robust monitoring system to ensure teachers have the knowledge and skills to impact positively and consistently on pupils' learning. Our forensic use of our data system means that we can track every child's progress, as we map out their pathway to success.
